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## Placement Prep Course Information

**Placement Prep** : These non-credit classes (**ASC 007 COMPASS Prep, ASC 008 TEAS Prep, and ASC 006 WorkKeys Prep**) are designed as individualized, self-paced, short duration brush-up for those looking for some quick math, reading, writing, science, and/or test-taking skill review in preparation for program entrance assessment (e.g. TEAS or COMPASS). Students will meet with an ASC instructor for an orientation session and will be encouraged to take a diagnostic assessment. Students select their focus topics and work at their own pace with appropriate practice questions and self-study materials, including PLATO, a 24/7 internet-based learning system. The students' review is self-directed, but instructors are available to answer questions and to offer skill building and strategy tips. Students are generally limited to about three ASC prep visits. Should more comprehensive review be indicated, the student will be referred to the appropriate essential basic skills and/or adult literacy course.

## Scores don't meet program admission? WATC offers skill review classes

WATC offers a variety of courses to prepare you for program admission or to help you improve your skill level. COMPASS scores indicate in which course(s) you should enroll. Visit with an academic coach to enroll for classes which include the following:

**MTH 035 PACER English (5 credits)** - This course is designed to equip students for success in the writing, reading, and effective student skills required during academic endeavors at the college level. Review of grammar and reading skills is individualized and self-paced, using a computerized software program in addition to instructor-led lessons. Writing assignments will include a number of paragraphs and reading will include practice with college-level texts. To demonstrate readiness for and to be allowed to enroll in ENG 101 Composition I, students must pass this course with a grade of C or above. *-This course does not count toward AS, AA, AGS or AAS degrees.*

**ENG 101 COMPOSITION (3 credits) with ENG 100 COMPOSITION LAB (1 credit)** - This course with lab is designed to improve the reading and writing skills of students. The emphasis is on fundamental principles of written English in structurally correct sentences, paragraphs and expository themes. Critical analysis of essays will be used to aid in developing the student's thinking, support of thesis and style. Students are introduced to the basic components of research by writing a documented essay in Modern Language Association (MLA) style. The lab portion is designed for students to work in an adaptive setting based on their skills and needs in reading and writing skills. Students will take this lab in conjunction with English 101 Composition I. To demonstrate readiness for and to be allowed to enroll in ENG 102 Composition II, students must pass this course with a grade of C or above.

**MTH 025 PACER Math (3 credits)** – This course provides the opportunity for students to master the math skills required for their chosen academic/career goals via an individualized, self-accelerated pathway. This course is equivalent to MTH020 - Math Fundamentals *This course does not count toward AS, AA, AGS or AAS degrees to fulfill a math requirement.*

**MTH 020 Math Fundamentals (3 Credits)** – This course provides students with the skills necessary to be successful in their math courses. The course is designed to identify the student's specific learning style, provide note taking/test taking techniques, and offer math preparation strategies. *This course does not count toward the A.A., A.S., A.A.S., or A.G. S. degree.*

**Placement Prep and skill review courses are offered at NCAT, SSEC, and Grove campuses.**
