### Wichita Area Technical College to The School of Adult and Graduate Studies of Tabor College

#### ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

This agreement is subject to the following provisions:

- 1. This agreement provides for the seamless transition of a student from the Wichita Area Technical College (WATC) to the following programs offered by the School of Adult and Graduate Studies of Tabor College (AGS):
  - A. Bachelor of Science in Christian Ministry
  - B. Bachelor of Science in Business Administration/Accounting
  - C. Bachelor of Science in Business Administration/Entrepreneurship
  - D. Bachelor of Science in Business Administration/Health Care Administration
  - E. Bachelor of Science in Business Administration/Human Resources
  - F. Bachelor of Science in Business Administration/Operations Management
  - G. Associate of Science in Business
  - H. General Education Courses
- 2. Included in the coverage of this agreement are current and former WATC students whose earned college credit hours were awarded under accreditation by the Higher Learning Commission, excluding credit hours awarded for remedial-type courses. Examples of WATC students covered by this agreement include graduates with an Associate of Applied Science degree, a Technical Certificate authorized by the Kansas Board of Regents, or a Certificate of Completion authorized by the Kansas Board of Regents, as well as students who completed individual college credit courses at WATC that did not result in the award of a degree or certificate.
- 3. To obtain an AGS degree listed in paragraph 1. above, students covered by this agreement will be required to complete the AGS education requirements applicable to the specific AGS degree. The manner of crediting WATC courses toward AGS degrees can be found in the attached appendices.
  - a. Credit hours transferred from WATC will be applied to AGS degrees as lower division (freshman and sophomore) credit hours and will not be applied to upper division (junior and senior) course requirements.
  - b. Transfer under this agreement of those WATC program courses that primarily teach a person how to do a specific skill with minimal attention to theoretical concepts will be capped at a maximum of 40 credit hours. Examples include courses designed to provide hands-on clinical experience, hands-on aerostructures assembly experience, or hands-on service work experience.
- 4. Each of the Bachelor of Science degrees listed in paragraph 1. above requires at least 124 total credit hours. At least 30 of the 124 credit hours must be taken from Tabor College, at least 40 of the 124 credit hours must be in upper division courses, and the requirements of the specific degree plan must be met for graduation.
- 5. The Associate of Science degree listed in paragraph 1. above requires at least 60 total credit hours. At least 15 of the 60 credit hours must be taken from Tabor College and the requirements of the specific degree plan must be met for graduation.

- 6. While attending WATC, the student shall have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- 7. For each current or former WATC student covered by this agreement who applies for admission to AGS, AGS will develop course-to-course equivalencies, transfer guides, and degree plans.
- 8. WATC and AGS will include information about this agreement in their respective college catalogs and websites. WATC and AGS will work together to train their respective Academic Coaches, Enrollment Consultants, and other applicable staff members on the operations of this agreement.

The transfer process to AGS is initiated when the student submits to AGS an application for admission and provides official transcripts indicating that the student has met the criteria of this agreement. The AGS Director of Enrollment Services will formally notify the student of his/her admission status to AGS.

Upon formal approval of this articulation agreement by the appropriate officials of the two institutions, each is free to publicize the terms herein. This agreement shall remain in effect until one or all of the institutions deem it necessary to modify or terminate the agreement.
