Policy Statement

The Division of Adult Education is authorized to operate a General Education Development (GED) Testing Center. Successful completion of the GED test will result in receiving a Kansas State High School diploma.

Implemental Procedures:

- 1) The following procedure is used to obtain a Kansas State High School diploma:
- 2) a) Prior to taking the GED test, the Official Practice Tests (OPT's) must be passed with a minimum score of 450 on each of the five tests with a cumulative score of 2250. OPT's must be completed at an approved testing site.
b) Registration to take the GED test may be done at the GED Testing Center.
c) Minimum age is 18. An applicant, who is 16-17 years of age not enrolled in high school, suspended or expelled, and meets all of the requirements except age, may complete the test and receive a Kansas High School diploma if he/she completes a disclaimer before testing. A person under 16 years of age is not eligible to take the test.
d) Minimum test scores: A standard score of 420 on each of the five tests with a cumulative score of 2250.
e) Upon successful completion of all requirements, the individual will receive the Kansas State High School Diploma.
