1 Complete and submit WSU Tech application.

2 Request Official Transcripts (High School and College)

• High School or GED Transcripts

- Applicants seeking admission to WSU Tech must provide an official high school or GED transcript. Official transcripts must be mailed or transferred electronically directly from the issuing institution and received by the Registrar's Office prior to registering for classes. Transcripts must be in a sealed envelope upon receipt and may not be stamped with "student copy".

• College Transcripts

- Request official transcripts be sent from each institution from which coursework is to be transferred. Transfer credits must have been earned at an accredited institution. Equivalent coursework for which students have earned a letter grade of a 'C' or better is considered for transfer. Official transcripts must be mailed or transferred electronically directly from the issuing institution and received by the Registrar's Office prior to registering for classes. Official transcripts must be in a sealed envelope upon receipt.

3 Take the Accuplacer Next Generation Reading and Writing assessments with a minimum score of 237

- **Assessments are available through the Testing Center at NCAT and the WSU South campuses. Visit www.wsutech.edu/admissions/testing for testing hours and to schedule an appointment. You can also schedule your test by calling them at (316) 677-9506.**
- A photo ID is required to take the assessments
- Results are valid for three years.
- Current high school students may substitute their ACT scores if the official scores are on file at WSU Tech showing a Reading and Writing score of 15 or above.
- **NOTE:** We also heavily recommend taking and passing Medical Terminology within the past 5 years with a C or better.

4 Register for the next available class

Registration is done at WSU Tech South (3821 E Harry) Campus. Registration is by appointment only during the week except on Wednesdays, where we accept walk ins from 8am to 5pm.

Uniform Requirements
