

Industrial Automation & Machine Maintenance Registered Apprenticeship Program



What is a Registered Apprenticeship?

The program is designed to combine classroom work with real-world application relating to the skills needed to work on machines used in manufacturing and automation. Apprentices attend class two days a week and work on-site with a mentor the remainder of the week, providing the opportunity to apply theory and hands-on skills learned in the classroom to the real-world work environment.

Application Process*

- 1) Fill out <u>WSU Tech application</u> for the Industrial Automation & Machine Maintenance program.
- 2) Meet with your <u>Academic Advisor</u>.
- 3) Meet with <u>Career Services</u> for resume and job search resources.
- 4) Complete the separate <u>Registered Apprenticeship application</u> and upload your applicable resume.
- 5) Attend WSU Tech job fair.
- 6) You must become an employee of a company who has agreed to the apprenticeship standards before you will be enrolled in class. If selected by a company for employment, you must attend a WSU Tech Registered Apprenticeship orientation the first week of class.
- 7) Completion of Registered Apprenticeship is earned upon successful completion of coursework and once competency skills have been met through work processes outlined in the standards.

*To Qualify:

Must be 18 or older by the start of your apprenticeship. Must have earned a High School Diploma or GED by the start of your apprenticeship.
